# *From your Parish Council*



**We are very conscious as we prepare this Chronicle of the hardship and devastation of lives occurring in the Ukraine. Our hearts and minds go out to all who are affected, and will try and do all we can to support in any way appropriate as the situation unfolds**

Sunday March 20<sup>th</sup> will be the first Village litter pick and path clearance of 2022. We invite you to join us, we will cover the whole of the Village including neighbouring sections of woodland paths, so the more the merrier. You will need appropriate footwear and clothing, hi-viz jacket if you have one, as well as gardening gloves. Your Parish Council will provide litter pickers, bags, hoops and, if required hi-viz jackets. If you can join us, it will be helpful if you can let me know.

**VILLAGE LITTER PICK 20 MARCH 10AM-12NOON, MEET AT THE VILLAGE HALL. REFRESHMENTS TO FOLLOW.**

As yet I haven't received any feedback from villagers on the High Kelling Parish Chronicle (mentioned in the last issue). I guess perhaps this isn't necessarily a bad sign in itself. But if there is something you want to say it's not too late to respond. I'm always happy to receive your comments. As mentioned in the last issue, we are very mindful of the pressures on family budgets. One of the ways of keeping Parish Council costs down is to look at the frequency of a printed Parish Chronicle. The Chronicle is funded from our precept on the Council Tax and advertising revenue, being free to all households in High Kelling, rather than by subscription as was its predecessor the High Kelling News. We will, of course, keep you updated.

Parish Councillor Maureen Pearman is working hard with others from High Kelling and our neighbours on Village events for HM Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee. Following the success of the Victory 75 villagers' memories booklet we are looking at producing a similar one to celebrate this landmark.

**We are asking villagers to share their memories of events in the Queen's honour, for example the Coronation in 1953, street parties, also meeting the Queen or other members of the Royal Family, Buckingham Palace investitures and garden parties as well as thoughts about her reign. Or indeed anything else of relevance.**

As you may know, an amount of builders' rubble has been used to fill ruts on the track leading from the A148 to the side entrance of the old Pineheath Care Home. Your Parish Councillors feel this is not an attractive solution and is concerned that it could prove a hazard to ramblers, dog walkers etc. It is understood this track is a right of way and we have submitted an application for the track to be declared a public footpath. Please do take care if you choose to use the track. We are seeking details of ownership with a view to seeking a better solution to the problem.

I'm sure we all appreciate the greenery, vegetation and flora in our Village. But may I again please ask all villagers to be mindful of the obstruction to public footpaths which could cause accidents. Hedges and trees where they encroach should be trimmed back to allow the full width of the footpath to be used, especially important in the absence of streetlights. I was very pleased to see the daffodil bulbs planted at the Holt end High Kelling sign have flowered, soon to be joined by the numerous others planted along the A148. Many thanks to Cllr Susan Rutherford and others for their work on the planting.

At the time of writing, work has commenced on sluices on the west side of Bridge Rd to address the flooding of the road. After heavy rain there is also often standing water outside Birkfield House. We will keep an eye on the situation to see if this reoccurs and, if so, raise it with Norfolk County Council.

There are four locations in our Village that have equipment fitted to boost the 3G signal for mobile phones etc. There are plans in place to remove this equipment

if, as expected, other more recent improvements have rendered it redundant. A survey is planned for the beginning of March this year. I am happy to pass any comments you have onto the company undertaking the survey. Please let me have any comments ASAP.

## *Update on High Kelling matters:*

**Speeding** - Our Community policeman, PC Gower-Smith, has come and parked for his worktime breaks at various places along the A148 to slow down traffic. It certainly works for as long as he is there, but the effect is only temporary! He will carry on doing this during his breaks as much as he can - every little helps, and the Parish Council has expressed their thanks to PC Gower-Smith.

**Potholes** - Not aware of any big potholes on A148 that need filling - do please report online to Highways if you see any.

**Gas structure opposite Beech Close** - The storm-damaged building has been replaced with a containerised unit. Building debris and temporary surface planks have not yet been removed.

**Pavements** - The clearing back of the pavement from Avenue Road to the Bodham edge of the village gives more width for pedestrians to keep back from the traffic. State of pavement from Beech Close to Bodham end of the woods is quite uneven due to roots, deterioration etc in places. This has been reported to Highways, requesting this is resurfaced to same standard as Beech Road to Vale Road stretch, which would certainly help.

**Bridge Road Water Repairs** – Repairs to fix water leak commenced late February. Hopefully by the time you see this, repairs will be completed, and the puddles will have subsided/disappeared!

The following is further communication with reference to a letter in February's Chronicle from Mr. Allard and the reply from Cllr Lane regarding the rubble left on the footpath by the side of the old Pineheath Nursing Home. The Parish Council received this letter from Lyn and Ray Morgan, Avenue Road:

***'As we walk our dogs on the footpath, which originally went to Pineheath Nursing Home, we are very familiar with the rubble deposited there. It is not exactly rubble but broken tiles, they are extremely sharp and very dangerous to dogs' feet and obviously to local wildlife. A large plastic bag is also under the broken tiles which we assume is what originally held the tiles. It is obviously fly tipping as its distance from the main road makes it difficult to be seen by anyone using the A148. This is not the first time fly tipping has taken place on this footpath, the last time it was a quantity of vehicle tyres, which were removed by NNDC. If you use this footpath with a dog or small children, please be very careful.'***

The Parish Council reported the issue to the North Norfolk District Council and received the response as follows:

***'The District Council does have powers to deal with fly tipping on private land, at the request of the landowner, however these powers***

*are seldom used, with other methods preferred in the first instance should there be a serious problem or threat. Equally, if the landowner themselves is culpable of an offence under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (EPA) we can intervene. In this instance however, I do not consider this as fly tipping or an offence, littering or otherwise, under the EPA and as such would not look to take this matter any further.'*

The Parish Council is making contact with the Property Owner to ask them to cover the sharp-edged builders' debris to avoid injury to animals.

## **CELEBRATING THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE IN TREES AND FLOWERS**

## *News from Your Village Hall*

I'm pleased to report that you are now able to nominate High Kelling Village Hall as your chosen charity on Amazon Smile. In order for Amazon to make its 0.5% donation to charities, one must purchase via the Amazon Smile site. Please do consider entering the hall as your chosen charity for your Amazon purchases.

Our annual gas safety check highlighted an issue with the flue to one of the boilers. Unfortunately, the issue required immediate rectification and it proved impossible to obtain replacement parts, meaning that we had to replace the boiler at a cost of over £2,800. On the other hand, I think we can count ourselves very lucky to have the new boiler installed and operational within a fortnight of the old one's failure.

The sexennial building inspection is being carried out on 9<sup>th</sup> March, with Canham Consulting's report due by the end of the month. The findings will identify issues that require attention, their urgency and an estimate of costs involved. Part of me is looking forward to receiving this professional analysis of the fabric of the hall but another part of me is dreading the possibility of bad news!

Many of the clubs that use the hall are actively looking for new members. Some activities such as Short Mat Bowls and Table Tennis offer initial sessions for free, so an opportunity to try before you buy. Whether it's taking up a pencil, a brush, a needle, a bat, a bowl, some cards or just your own body there's something for everyone. 

Dear Friends,

In an increasingly secular society in which Christianity is no longer cultural, but rather a choice, I find it quite reassuring that the Church's calendar is still able to dictate the date our country marks Mother's Day. Unlike our friends across the pond in America when Mother's Day, a 20<sup>th</sup> century invention, is always on the second Sunday of May, Mother's Day in the UK is in fact Mothering Sunday, which is observed three weeks before Easter, on the fourth Sunday of Lent.

Based on the lunar calendar, the date of Easter always falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon which follows the Spring equinox in March. Therefore, the date of Easter can occur as early as the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March or as late as the 25<sup>th</sup> April, and so the date of Mothering Sunday falls on a different date each year. It must drive the card manufacturers and retailers mad!

Yet, it means that Mother's Day remains rooted in an ancient Christian tradition which not only honours and give thanks for those whose love brought

us into this world but also honours Mother Church together with Blessed Mary, the Mother of the Lord.

## *Thinking of Ukraine*




