Ithough there was no Parish Council meeting in December, there was still plenty for us to do: extra bulb planting has taken place, and we have been reviewing the Parish Chronicle after the first twelve issues. We feel it has been well

Bridge Rd remains on the agenda. The fact that at the recent site visit with Norfolk CC Highways it didn't prove possible to establish priority for vehicles crossing the bridge or get the speed limit reduced, is a concern. Your Parish Council doesn't as such have any direct control over these matters, but please be assured we are looking at other measures.

The village-wide email system should shortly come into use giving the Parish Council the ability to bring to you matters of interest or concern. If you wish to join and didn't return the slip in previous issues of the Parish Chronicle, it's not too late. Just email the Parish Clerk.

A big thanks to all villagers that have removed leaves and vegetation affecting footpaths adjacent to their gardens. Very much appreciated.

I'm writing this in mid-December, concerned as I'm sure you are, about Omicron, the latest variant of Covid-19. Perhaps it's time to recognise how we have all pulled together to get through the pandemic, but let's not let our guard down now. Your Parish Council will do all in its power to support villagers and village life.

Finally, a big thank you to those villagers who offered to donate items for Afghan refugees. It's taken time but details on how to arrange collection have now been received and passed to them.

News from Your Village Hall



s I write this, Plan B has just been introduced and yet again we're having to rethink our own plans and approach to everyday life. For our part, we have increased the frequency of fogging of the hall (a very fine misting of food safe disinfectant known to kill the virus). We are recommending that all hall users perform weekly lateral flow tests and check their temperature on entering the hall. Face coverings are now mandatory when not engaged in their group's activity.

The rule changes and concern about the current infection rate of the Covid virus has meant several booking cancellations, notably the bridge clubs, and we do not expect their return to play for some time, so they are excluded from our January 2022 diary.

Thank you to Ann, Sue and Janet for organising the All Saints Coffee Morning on the 8th December. A very sociable event to kick off the season and over £200 raised to help fund our local church.

Thanks also to Ann Alborough, Sue Hebburn, John Mangan and the team for organising the splendid carols, mulled wine & mince pies on the 10th December. A lovely, if cool, evening with Fr. Howard providing

the novelty of prayer combined with stand-up comedy – thank you! Pub Night immediately followed and the fellowship continued to closing time – many thanks to those who stayed on to make such an enjoyable atmosphere.

The six year review of the state of the fabric of the hall is due next February and we are in the process of obtaining an appropriate inspection. The building is a timber frame construction with the main load-bearing supports being 9" x 4" laminated beams, which, after over 50 years service, show some signs of wear. We know there will be some remedial works to be done but we don't yet know the extent.

As New Year approaches, why not resolve to come along to one or more of the hall's regular events? All are very welcome. January's dates are:
